Findings

Two images of the pelvis and both stifles are provided for interpretation. There are seven lumbar type vertebrae. The first sacral segment is not fused to the sacrum and has hypoplastic transverse processes. The first caudal vertebra is fused to the caudal sacrum. The pelvis and coxofemoral joints are within normal limits. The stifles are normal. There are a few small mineral fragments in the stomach and mixed with the feces of the colon.

Conclusions

Transitional lumbosacral vertebra.
Unremarkable pelvis.
Non-obstructing G.I. foreign material.
